On $1 / 20: 69$, an individual identifying himself as JERRY HERALD, 3316 Willowerest Lane, Mallas, Texas, telephone number $339-1409$, telephonically advisod that he had received a communication from RICHARI BEBNABIE, Department of Classics, Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, wherein BERNABIE expressed an interest in pictures possessed by JERRY HERALD.

HFRALD advised that he was interviewed shortly after the assassination inasmuch as he was a photograpler and reporter for the "Paris-Match"'marrazine, and had furnished all information in his possession to the FBI He stated that he was curious as to whether he should consent 10 an interview with BERNABIE, or furnish any informatlon in his posisesston to BERNABIE, inasmuch as he was told when interviewed by the FBI that he should not discuss the matier with other persons.

Mr. MERALD was advised that it was strictly his own decision to make with respect as to whether he desired to consent to an interview or furnish any information to RICHARD BERNABIE and that the FBI could not advise him in this regard.

JERRY ALLEN HERALD, who is identical to the above individual, is referred to in serials 7079, 7080, 7261, 7262 and 7794 of DLfile $100-10461$, and such references refer to his accompanying a Miss JEAN CAMPBELL, a reporter of the "London Evening Standard", shortly after the assassination, to Irving, Texas, and their interviews at a furniture store about a possible visit of OSHALD who had inquired about the location of a gun shop.
