Hoover Calls Panthers Top Threat to Security

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said yesterday that of black extremist groups the "Black Panther Party, without question, represents the greatest threat to the internal security of the country."

In his report on bureau activities for fiscal 1969, Hoover said Panther "members have perpetrated numerous assaults on police officers and have engaged in violent confrontations with police in cities throughout the country."
