## YOUNG URGES RESIGNATION OF HANRAHAN

Whitney Young Jr., executive director of the National Urban League, yesterday supported the Chicago Urban League in its call for the resignation of State's Atty. Edward V. Hanrahan.

Young, speaking at a press conference, called Hanrahan "brutal" in dealing with the Black Panthers and "inefficient" in dealing with organized crime. He referred to the killing of two Black Panther leaders in a raid by state's attorney's police.

"If Hanrahan's new-found efficiency and courage in moving in on the Panthers had been used in moving in on the Mafia . . . then we would believe we were not being singled out," he said. "Seventy per cent of the crime in the black community is tied to drugs, numbers, prostitution—these are perpetuated by the downtown syndicate.

"Unless there is a followup of this [Panther raid] investigation, which the grand jury has chosen to drop, it will be another example of the black community being singled out for oppression," he added. "A credibility gap now exists—this will increase that credibility gap."

Young, who also is president of the National Association of Social Workers, was here for the National Conference on Social Welfare, which continues thru today in the Conrad Hilton hotel. He indorsed a minimum income of \$5,900, saying the figure is not unrealistic if looked upon as an investment.

He called on President Nixon to pull out of Viet Nam, saying there will be no real peace till social ills are cured.
