

Cleaver Assails Carmichael

ALGIERS, July 15—Author Eldridge Cleaver arrived here today to attend a Pan African Cultural Festival and promptly issued a broadside against another guest at the festival, self-exiled black power organizer Stokely Carmichael.

Cleaver, a fugitive from the United States, who has been living in Cuba, is minister of information of the Black Panther Party. Carmichael and the Panthers have been in a running word duel over alliances the Panthers have made with white American groups. Carmichael, who has been living in Conakry, Guinea, denounced the Panthers and quit in a huff two weeks ago.

Cleaver charged today, in a

letter to Carmichael released here, that the former chairman of Student Nonviolent Co-ordinating Committee had entered a "coalition of purpose with the McLellan Committee in its attempt to destroy the Black Panther Party."

Sen. John McClellan (D-Ark.) held several days of hearings in Washington in which witnesses described bizarre tactics in which, they said, the Panthers engaged

Ridiculing Carmichael for saying in his letter that he had "undying love for black people," Cleaver said:

"You speak of any undying love for black people that denies the humanity of other people . . . It was an undying love for white people that led

them to deny the humanity of colored people and which has stripped white people of humanity itself."

Cleaver, who said he has become roving international editor of Ramparts Magazine, said his letter would appear in full in its September issue.

"You should know," he told Carmichael, "the suffering is

color blind and that the victims of imperialism, racism, colonialism come in all colors and that they need a unity based on revolutionary principles rather than skin color."

Carmichael, who ruled out alliances with white groups as "premature" at this time, has not arrived here for the festival, which opens on Monday.
