Cleaver to Return

Scornfully rebuking the Communist regimes in China and Cuba, Black Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver says he will end his Algerian exile and devote himself to urban guerrilla struggle in the United States.

The 36-year-old fugitive called Peking's invitations to President Nixon a set-

back to the worldwide revolutionary movement and said the Chinese aboutface helped him to make up his mind to go home.

Cleaver declined in an Associated Press interview to indicate when he would return, but he said it would be soon. The State Department has refused to renew his passport since he fled from the country in 1968 when his parole was revoked following a shootout with police in Oakland, Calif.

His wife Kathleen and their two children arrived in Boston Friday night.
