## POLICE SEARCH<sup>T</sup> AREA OF CACHE<sup>P</sup>

LIVINGSTON, La. (AP) — Authorities combed a wooded area near here Sunday where a huge cache of explosives and armaments was unearthed.

And a Livingston Parish couple remained jailed in neighboring Tangipahoa Parish on burglary and theft charges in connection with the find.

James Kinchen, 33, and his 30-year-old wife, Janice, were booked Friday after Tangipahoa Sheriff Frank Edwards said he had been tipped to the cache.

"It looks like a Minuteman storage area," Edwards said of the cache — which included about four tons of explosives, numerous firearms, medical supplies and clothing.

Edwards and area lawmen continued to look through the area Sunday for more supplies and the sheriff said he believed several persons were involved in the cache.

The explosives found were believed to have been part of the 7,250 pounds of explosives stolen from the D. L. Nicholson Co. of Roberts recently.
