Dear Harold Weisberg,

Penn Jones and I are working on a special magazine-book to be published by Latitudes Press in conjunction with the Midlothian Mirror. It will be a 50 page affair much like Latitudes #1, a new literary quarterly, which I have mailed you under separate cover.

I am not writing for money, but only to ask you to volunteer an essay on a particular aspect of the assassination. We would, of course, credit you and WHITEWASH I, II, II. We want to call on you for the most comprehensive area you know. The format will be an extended interview with Penn. When we reach specific areas we feel others are more informed on, we will insert their deposition. Right now Penn and I have not structured the interview, but have only this weekend decided to do it. It will come out this summer--will sell for one dollar. It will be titled simply NOVEMBER 22, 1963. We will send you gratis copies, of course.

This is simply a letter to see if YOU'RE INTERESTED, to see if you will stand by to see what we might ask you to do. Perhaps we might simply reprint from one of the WHITEWASH books--I do not know. The structure is tenuous now, but we are definitely going to do this assassination primer. We feel if all the major critics contribute, we can perhaps offset the crap Richard Warren Lewis and Dell are coming out with.

It will be professionally done. Even L.A. has promised to proofread.

Hope you are interested and will drop me a reaction. I know you are busy. I am helping Penn here in Houston and combing the volumes myself. I trust you will stand by and help us.

I will know more in a few weeks, once I hear from all the critics. Penn asked me to write all of you since I will be editing the manuscript. He will help me structure it, but he felt I should present the case. Well, is our case open?
