Perhaps you have been too busy to completely check them out as yet, or have copies made of them. At any rate, whenever you do, or whenever you can definitely determine whether Bob's death was suicide or not, I'd be very much interested to know the results. And would also like to re-read those letters

and study the pictures some more myself.

I can scarcely express my frustration at knowing a little of the investigation, which is being conducted from the Dist. Attor.'s office, and yet not knowing enough to know just how big a thing is involved. It might be national or even international in scope but why Bob, who died more than a year before Pres. Kennedy was murdered, or Nancy who is still under suspicion ????

I have not found any more letters from Nancy but did find one from The White House in El Paso, Tex. saying (in ans. to a letter from me) that Nancy checked in for <sup>work</sup> the morning of Sat. Aug. 8th, 1959, but only worked about an hour. Also that she worked there on (over)

Aug. 10 + Aug 11, 1959. Which information did not help any with my problem and I do not know that it will be of any interest to you.

Hope to hear from you if there is any more you can tell me and/or to receive back the letters and pictures if you are thru with them.
