This station aired the threat every 20 minutes or so. Soon the police were flooded with calls. They had to ask the station to stop rebroadcasting the item.

I believe this paper owns a large radio station, best-known and most powerful in the state, WBAL. It has FM and TV outlets. It is NBC-affiliated.
