

Bremer Moved to Medium Security

BALTIMORE, Dec. 19 (AP)—Arthur Herman, Bremer, serving a 63-year sentence for shooting former Alabama governor George Wallace during the 1972 presidential campaign, has been transferred to a medium-security prison after spending more than seven years in maximum security.

At Herndon, deputy state corrections commissioner, said today that the 28-year-old inmate was moved recently from the state penitentiary in Baltimore to Maryland Correctional Institution in Hagerstown.

tion of the penitentiary, Mr. Bremer has made satisfactory progress to the point he no longer requires maximum security," Herndon said.

He said Bremer had received "good grades" working in the penitentiary's print shop but was in need of "additional programming" not available at the maximum-security facility. "He has not been a disciplinary problem," Herndon added.

Wallace was left paralyzed from the waist down as a result of the shooting at a Laurel shopping mall in May 1972. Two other persons were wounded in the assassination attempt.
