Bremer Reading JFK Book

BALTIMORE (WP) — Arthur Herman Bremer, the 21-year-old former Milwaukee busboy accused of shooting Alabama Gov. Wallace, has resumed reading the book "RFK Must Die" in his Baltimore County jail cell.

Bremer's reading of the book, which was found in his car with clothes, notebooks and other items, was apparently interrupted when he was taken into custody by the FBI after the May 15 shooting of Wallace in a Laurel, Md., shopping center.

Sources said Bremer also has been reading newspapers and news magazines while awaiting federal and state trials on 28 charges including attempted murder.

The notebooks found in Bremer's car are in federal keeping and have not been made public. They are believed to contain references to travels he made to attend Wallace rallies in Michigan and Maryland.

Bremer's father, however, has challenged the photographs purporting to show his son at the rallies.

William Bremer, a Protestant of German ancestry who lives in Milwaukee and drives a truck for a living, said soon after his son's arrest: "It looks like they just superimposed him on those pictures. Why should they have taken pictures of him when he was just another face in the crowd?"

"RFK Must Die" is an account of the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy on the night of the California primary in 1968 and of the subsequent trial and conviction of his assassin, Sirhan B. Sirhan.

The book's author, Robert Blair Kaiser, is one of many journalists who have written to Bremer or his attorney seeking interviews.

No reply has been made to Kaiser or any other journalist, it was learned yesterday.

Bremer checked the Kaiser book out of the Milwaukee public library on May 5. He also checked out "Sirhan," by Aziz Shihab. Both books are overdue.
