Bremer Trial Date 6-14-72 Set For July 17th

BALTIMORE (AP) — A trial date of July 17 for Arthur H. Bremer on charges of shooting Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace and a Secret Service agent was set Tuesday by U.S. District Court Ludge Educated Service trict Court Judge Edward S. Northrop.

Northrop scheduled the trial at the conclusion of a hearing at which he signed a modified or-der for psychiatric exam-inations for Bremer.

No decision has apparently been reached on whether the 21-year old Milwaukee man will first stand trial on federal or

state charges.
Prince Georges County state's attorney Arthur Mar-shall earlier said July 12 was the tentative date for the state

Bremer faces state and federal charges in connection with the shootings of Wallace and three other persons during a May 15 campaign appearance

Bremer on charges of assault-ing a presidential candidate and a federal officer and for il-legal transportation of a pistol across state lines.

The state indictment charged Bremer with six offenses in connection with the wounding of the four: attempted murder, assault and battery. assault with intent to murder, assault with intent to maim and two violations of the state handgun control law.

Northrop modified his order Monday on a motion by Ben-jamin Lipsitz, Bremer's court-appointed attorney. Northrop agreed that psychiatrists who examine Bremer will be prohibited from later testifying as to his guilt or innocence.
