Johnson, singer-actor Sammy Davis Jr., guards at the Attica prison in New York, Guy Lombardo, Billy Graham, the Nationalist Chinese ambassador to the United States, a Navaho tribe in Arizona and Henry Cabot Lodge, special U.S. envoy to the Vatican who passed along expressions of sympathy from Pope Paul VI.

Though Wallace ate chicken broth on Friday, he was again fed intravenously yesterday, Camp told reporters, as part of the doctors' medical pre-scription. No decision, both Camp and hospital authorities reported, has been made as to when or where Wallace will be transferred.
