The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN LESTER QUIGLEY at New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 3, 1963:

Major PRESLEY J. TROSCLAIR, JR., Commander, Intelligence Unit, New Orleans Police Department, advised that he was familiar with the Cuban Student Directorate and its director, CARLOS BRINGUIER; however, he had no information regarding PHILLIP GERACI. He stated further his files did not reflect any information with respect to anyone being stopped and told they could not sell bonds for the Cuban Student Directorate without a permit.

Mr. HENRY A. DIEBOLD, Tax Administrator, Bureau of Tasury, City of New Orleans, City Hall, informed that his department normally handles the granting of permits in connection with parades and solicitation of handbills and products in the city of New Orleans; however, occasionally persons come to his office to obtain permits to solicit funds or make complaints with reference to individuals soliciting without a permit. Mr. DIEBOLD said that his files did not reflect any information with respect to anyone being stopped from soliciting funds for the Cuban Student Directorate in New Orleans. He further said the names of CARLOS BRINGUIER and PHILLIP GERACI did not appear in his files.

Mr. DIEBOID stated if such a complaint had been received in his department he would have known about it.
