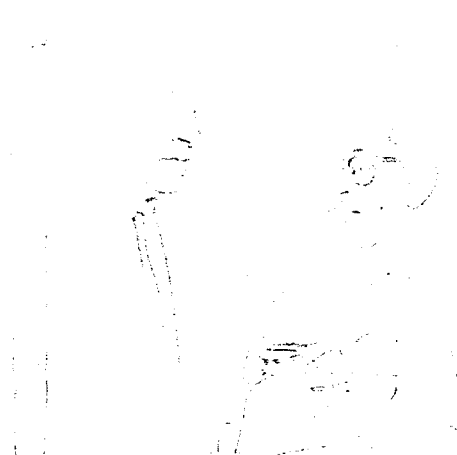

DEATH QUIZ FIGURE VIEWED AS PRO-CASTRO

Oswald's Trouble-Filled N.O. Stay Recalled

Brown-haired Lee Harvey Oswald, now accused of murdering President Kennedy, spent a trouble-filled summer in New Orleans this year.

Only days later, Oswald and three Cubans — including the and-Castro leader, Carlos Bringer — scuffled after Oswald had been handed out "Fair Play for Cuba" literature.

The scuffle got the least 16-year-old Oswald a \$10 fine in Municipal Court.

And at home, a one-block apartment at 492 Maguire, the wild and his Russian wife were in trouble with the landlord.

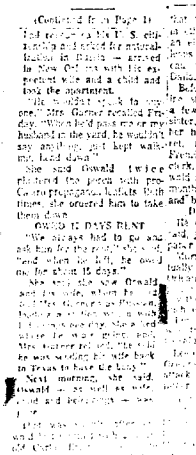
His pro-Castro views were sharply challenged in a fair-dollar war with Bringer and Edward Sennell Butler, executive vice-president of the Information Council of the Americas.

Oswald was born in New Orleans, shortly after his father had died. His mother, who the family moved here for her in the decade or more of years, then moved to Texas.

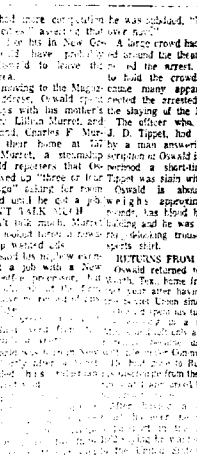

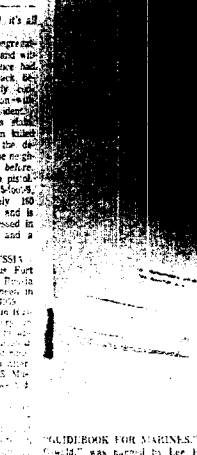
