### Says Red Regime Must Be Eradicated

Tranquility of the Americas for social progress through the Alliance for Progress will become feasible only when the Cuban Communist regime is totally eradicated, President Kennedy has been told in a letter from the Cuban Student Revolutionary Directorate.

The letter was released here Thursday by New Orleans directorate delegate Carlos Bringuier.

Luis Fernandez Rocha, directorate secretary-general and author of the letter, said in it that United States actions not aimed at elimination of the Castro regime "would be tantamount to admitting Soviet colonialism in our hemisphere."

It said the directorate would continue to fight if the U.S. declined to topple Castro.

The letter also criticized Kennedy's blockade speech of Oct. 22 "when the energetic reply to the arrogant Soviet buildup in Cuba was couched in terms of material danger, and not placed on a plane of ideological incompatibility.

"The tranquility of the Americas, imperative for the advance of social progress through the Alliance for Progress, will become feasible only when the Cuban Communist regime is totally eradicated," the letter said.

## Argentina to Be Bringuier Topic

A former Cuban lawyer with a first-hand knowledge of Argentina will speak to the Information Council of the Americas Tuesday as it focuses attention on Argentina.

Carlos J. Bringuier, who now lives in New Orleans, lived in Argentina for a time, then returned to Cuba before the rise of the Castro regime. After Castro's rise to power he returned to Argentina to work for a law magazine.

The INCA forum will be held at noon Tuesday at the International House. Edward Scannell Butler, vice president of the council, will describe what the

council is doing to combat Communist penetration in Argentina. R. Kirk Moyer is president of the council.

## Cuban Freedom Fighter Backed

Cuban freedom fighter Felipe Rivero Diaz should not be deported but instead helped in his anti-Castro fight, according to a telegram sent to President Lyndon B. Johnson by Carlos Bringuier.

Bringuier, chairman, New Orleans delegation, Cuban Student Directorate, says that the deportation "would not stop patriotic activities to reconquer our fatherland. We want to give freedom to our country as you want to give freedom to South Vietnam . . .

"It is amazing that a person who loves freedom and democracy could be in jail at this moment and some others who are out trying to destroy the institutions and foundations of this country are allowed to enjoy the freedom and democracy that they want to destroy."
