On April 20, 1965, one [redacted] W/M residing at [redacted] [redacted], La. was reported missing by [redacted]. Shortly thereafter this officer had the occasion to speak to [redacted] as to the possible location of [redacted] and his reason for leaving home. Mr. [redacted] stated that he had deep concern as to the whereabouts of [redacted] due to the fact he had found several books concerning Guerrilla Warfare locked in his room. It was discovered [redacted] was investigated by the Warren Committee and also by the F.B.I. [redacted] was associated with Lee Harvey Oswald and with such groups as Alpha 00 and Morgan's brigade but as to his involvement was disclosed at this time. [redacted] had in his possession several books and writings taken from [redacted] room, one of these books was 150 Questions for a Guerrilla by General Alberto Coys. Writings were found on such topics as concealment, night movement, how one goes about taking over a Country Red Style and techniques for making bombs, placement of them for maximum effect and how to go about exploding these bombs.

~~Mr. Geraci stated by [redacted] his son was receiving psychiatric help through Dr. Hutchinson at the Tulane University and was very unstable at the time of his leaving. Philip Geraci III hated his father with a passion. During his last week home, if his father had touched a door knob, his son would wipe it off with a clean cloth before touching it. He refused to eat off the same dishes with his father or eat at the same table. Mr. Geraci worked at the N.A.S.A. plant and required a "secret" clearance and he was concerned as to whether his son would try to get to him through employment by planting a bomb. Philip Geraci III had knowledge of how to make a bomb through the books he had on Guerrilla Warfare. Philip also had access to chemicals at school due to the fact that he was taking Chemistry at East Jefferson. He had also toured the N.A.S.A. plant when his father noticed Philip looking over the security.~~

Mr. Geraci also had writings where his son had organized a group called the "March Scurgeons" wherein students who wished to join could file an application to his organization. The name of the organization was "Liberation Rather Than Oppression". The membership in this organization were as follows:

William Dwyer Jr. was the first of Philip's associates that this officer contacted. Dwyer stated that Philip was a b. [redacted] and boy who could do anything.
