Kunstler said he preferred the later date, while U.S. assistant attorney Julian Murray, representing the government, said he preferred a much earlier date. Judge Rubin then officially set the January date.

Following the hearing in Judge Rubin's court, Kuntsler told the press that he intends to subpoena FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover because of the recent FBI move placing Brown on its list of most wanted criminals.

Kunstler said Brown's inclusion on the list made him an easy target for "trigger-happy cops."

The federal charge against Brown, he said, was strictly 'political persecution."

Kunstler was accompanied to the courtroom by Etta May Hearn, a Baton Rouge attorney who also represents Brown.
