They are in tbe basement, are quite extensive, and I can't handle the steps of ten and can stand still, such as at file drawers, only briofly.So, I donot file any more FOIA suits but I did get quite a bit by using the law.

I don't think I can remember the future so I can't say what will happen. I'm inclined to believe that there will not be anything that cones out that will "solve" the assassinations. I doubt you'll remember me, but
I first heard of you when I was at New York University. It was 1974 or 1975 when my room mate and I attend ied a symposium on the JFK assassination. You were unable to attend due to illness, but Jim cesar read your speech. It was the one speech that intrigued me. I had always been interested in the events of November 1963, but until I sent for the Whitewash series and later Post.Mortem
I never realized the extent of the coverup. Most of the other books tried to speculate on who Killed the President. Many of those books, which continue to be published, don't deal in fact and yours did. Beyond that I came to admire your drive, your stick-it-to-itiveness. Other critics were around when it was profitable and then get out. Just reantly on a talk show here in L.A. I heard Josiah Thompson speaking about a new book. When any caller asked questions about six Seconds In Dallas, he refused, to talk about the subject. That time is past and I want to get on with my life he sound.

My name is Robert Bruce and for a while I wrote to you and sent you clippings from various newspapers (at the time the now defunct Tattler was putting out specials on the JFK/RFK and King assassinations) A but has happened since then My roommate at college Jerry Kay and I met you when you spoke at Hunter college in New york. He went on to become an attorney. Last year he got cancer and died this past April. I came out to Los Angeles to write comedy. I have been fortunate in my endeavors. I am currently a co-producer on "The Golden Girls" (although these days I spend more time with a picket sign in my hand than a pencil).

Throughout all this I have not lost interest in the JFK assassination. In fact, as time rolls on I become more angered. I have gone back to reread your books a number of times. I have watched all the Congressional investigations and seen them come come to the same condusions as the warren Commission. Even when the Assassinations committer was forced to admit
conspiracies, they down played it. They said Oswald fired the fatal shot, so it's insignificant that the second gunman got away. I have seen the L.A. Police Department release documents from RFK's assassination and like all of these investigations, evidence has been tampered with, destroyed on manipulated to fit the official story. And perhaps the saddest thurs is that the public docent care anymore. Sure, they discount the official stories of the assassination, but were waw, past the point of calling for a new investigation. Even if the Justice Department acted en en the evidence turned over to them bo the Assassinations Committed, could we expect them to truly investigate? I don't need to answer that. The public has become ind fferent to these scandals and cover-ups because we now Know its business as usual. It's only natural that we distrust the governmint. Who is shocked by the indictments or investigations of the Reagan administration seemed to make people want to know more about the governmorit. They wanted an accounting of what was going on.
