MAE BRUSSELL

For more than 25 years, Mae Brussell was America's foremost researcher into the hidden history of war, political assassinations, covert operations and espionage, terrorism and mind control, secret societies, banking and organized crime, and the origins and rise of international fascism. She held the *George Seligman Award* for 1987 from the Society of Journalists, and was listed in *The International Who's Who of Intellectuals* in 1983. Mae died on October 3, 1988.

She published many articles, including "Why Was Martha Mitchell Kidnapped?" and "The Senate Select Committee is Part of the Cover Up" about Watergate, and "Why Was Patty Hearst Kidnapped?" about the SLA and the CIA, in *The Realist* during the 1970's, and "The Nazi Connection to the John F. Kennedy Assassination" in *Rebel*.

Mae's weekly radio show, "*World Watchers International*" ran for 851 weeks on stations KLRB-FM, Carmel, California and KAZU-FM, Pacific Grove, California, a total of 17 years of radio newscasting. She also appeared on numerous radio and television talk shows and interview programs, including station WBAL-FM in New York, and KGO-AM in San Francisco.

Mae Brussell lectured at various universities on the subject of political assassinations, their inter-locking links, the causes, and the people behind the murders. She was among the first researchers to connect the murders of John and Robert Kennedy, Martin Luther King, Malcolm X and others, relying on her exhaustive cross-reference index of the Warren Commission evidence, and a steady diet of 15 daily newspapers, 150 monthly periodicals, and some 1,000 books a year.

Mae Brussell was born on May 29, 1922, in Beverly Hills, California, a daughter of Rabbi Edgar Magnin. She was a student in philosophy at Stanford University from 1940 to 1943. Mae raised five children from two marriages, David and John Goodwin, and Barbara, Bonnie and Kylene Brussell.

Mae was the founding member of *World Watchers International*, attempting to stop World War III.

MAE BRUSSELL RESEARCH CENTER

Mae Brussell asked that a library and research center be established in her name in Santa Cruz, California. The purposes of the center are:

- To educate and inform researchers, authors, students and the public on the history and causes of war, political violence and assassinations in the 20th Century.
- To preserve and expand the collected writings, files, tapes, videotapes and books that served as the basis for Mae Brussell's research into the hidden history of political assassinations, covert operations, mind control and international fascism.
- To serve as a central repository for information from other researchers and authors on these topics, as well as an archive for other collected works and files.
- To transcribe, index and computerize the 851 broadcasts of *World Watchers International* weekly programs, and other recorded lectures and interviews by Mae Brussell.
- To publish articles and books, develop tapes and videotapes, and publicize and disseminate critical information on Mae Brussell's analysis of past events, as well as current and future trends towards what she calls "the Nazification of America."
- To make available to serious researchers a library and file system, and a computerized data base of information that will make possible further study and analysis on the topics Mae Brussell's work connects.
- To publish and disseminate the collected writings of Mae Brussell in a single volume, as well as using the transcripts to develop books on key topic areas in Mae's work.

The Mae Brussell Research Center will allow a broad range of investigators to share information, continue the search for hidden facts, and access to the vast resources and connections that characterize Mae Brussell's work.

The current collection includes dozens of filing cabinets on critical topics, thousands of books and manuscripts on every critical area of related research, videotape and cassette collections, and extensive, up-to-date clippings and articles on key subjects. The complete files and books of researcher and author John Judge have been added to the collection already, and he will be serving as the curator and archivist for the materials.
