Dr. Thomas Gets 16 Years

In Detroit Spy Plot Case By the Associated Press. Yaw, 44 DETROIT, Mar. 16, Frederal Judge Edward J. Moinet today sen-tenced Dr. Fred W. Thomas, De-troit obstretrician convicted of con-spiracy to violate the Wartime Espionera Act to 16 years in Federal Espionage Act, to 16 years in Federal

Espionage Act, to 16 years in Federal prison. Dr. Thomas, one of eight persons indicted on charges of espionage conspiracy, was convicted two weeks ago by a Federal Court jury. Six pleaded guilty and are awaiting sentencing. Charges against the eighth, Bertrand Stuart Hoffman, a merchant marine seaman, were dis-missed on the ground he was mentmissed on the ground he was mentally incapable of understanding the charge. Dr. Thomas was accused of sup-

plying espionage information on war production and troop movements and ingredients for manufacture of invisible ink to Miss-Grace Buchanan-Dineen, described by the Federal Bureau of Investigation as the leader of the espionage ring.
