## Hearst Case Figure Is Reported Missing

NEW YORK, Aug. 11 (AP)—Jack Scott, who has been subpoenaed by a Harrisburg, Pa., grand jury investigating the Patricia Hearst case, says his brother Walter has disappeared after expressing fear for his life.

Scott said he last saw his brother Thursday, Aug. 7, in the lobby of a hotel here.

During a conversation between the brothers in the lobby, "Walter told (me) he is afraid for his life," Scott told the New York Daily News on Sunday.

"He went to make a telephone call to David Rack, an FBI agent who befriended him, to tell him as a courtesy that he planned to make a statement in our behalf," Scott said. "I haven't seen him

since. In fact, I still have his luggage."

Walter Scott reportedly told the FBI earlier this year that Hearst and three other persons had holed up for a while in a house which Jack's wife, Miki, rented near South Canaan, Pa.

However, Scott said his brother had second thoughts about cooperating with federal agents and came to New York to make a statement about illegal FBI wire taps for Jack's lawyers.

"We were going to meet a lawyer upstairs to take his statement," Scott said. "Then he went to make that phone call and never came back."

Jack Scott has been called to testify Sept. 4.
