Anti-Bundy Protest

HONG KONG—American graduate students studying Chinese affairs refused to eat with or talk to McGeorge Bundy during his recent visit here in order to protest the former presidential assistant's role in the U.S. involvement in Vietnam.

Now president of the Ford Foundation, Bundy was the guest at a luncheon at the Universities Service Center, a research center for scholars and graduate students, financed in part by the foundation.

As Bundy and 27 persons associated with the center sat down, one of the graduate students rose and read a statement saying that the graduate students intended to conduct a silent vigil "in memory of those killed in Vietnam."
