Nixon and Court

PRESIDENT Nixon's attitude toward the Supreme Court has caused new apprehension among some of the justices.

He used the Supreme Court as a whipping boy during the 1968 campaign. Now he has taken a public stand against two crucial and unanimous Supreme Court decisions (1) upholding the use of busing to desegregate schools and (2) barring government aid to parochial schools.

The justices are wondering whether Mr. Nixon intends to campaign against political advantage, is willing to undermine the nation's highest court.

White House aides have assured us, however, that the President will enforce the court's decisions even though he may disagree with them.
