Statements of Witnesses - Warren H. BURROUGHS
Deposition -

April 8, 1964, 7 H 14-7

He is 22 years old, quit school in the 9th grade, and is going to a private school 2 days a week. He couldn't pass what he described as "the mental part" of the army induction examination. He worked at the Texas Theater where, during the week, he takes tickets and cares for the concession and on weekends ushers.

Although he had gone to work at 12, he said he had "a lot of stock candy to count and put in the candy case for the coming night ..." and he didn't see the man enter the theatre. He believes the man went up into the balcony. (p.15)

He saw no signs of violence against Oswald, said Oswald was hollering, "I demand my rights," and he demonstrated by holding both hands above his head. He said that before the police put him into the car, Oswald had both hands handcuffed behind him.
