It is impossible for me to send you a list of the documents I have. That would take up file drawers of pages. I have more than a quarter of a million pages of records and never had occasion to make any list of them.


While I make this information available to others it is beyond my capabilities to do the research for them. I am 76 and in impaired health.

A letter addressed merely The National Archives, Washington, D.C. will reach it. It might save time once it gets there to note something like JFK assassination records on the envelope. I've not been able to get there in some years and can no longer give you a name. However, you have to be able to request with specificity because they also cannot engage in the research for you. As of my last information they charged 25¢ a page for xeroxes.

You might be able to do better, if you can say exactly what you want, to ask the Assassinations Archive and Research Center, 918 F St., NW, #510, Washington, D.C. 20004. It is a private organization.

I enclose a list of my books.
