## McCloy's View Caro, Warren Unit 2-3-47 Should Have Seen Films

WASHINGTON (UPI) - John J. McCloy, a member of the Warren Commission, said Sunday "for the sake of completeness," the official investigation of the Kennedy assassination should have included a look at the late President's autopsy photo-

graphs and X-rays.

The Commission had the power to subpena the films, he said, but chose not to. "Wewere perhaps a little oversensitive to what we understood was the sensitivities of the Kennedy family against the production of colored photographs of the body, and so forth," he said.

McCloy disclosed in a television interview (Face The Nation-CBS) that Chief Justice Earl Warren, Commission chairman, discussed the photographs with the Kennedy family, which had them dur-

ing the inquiry.

"I think there's one thing I would do over again," he said. "I would insist on those photographs and the X-rays having been produced before us."
