

JFK Autopsy

John J. McCloy, a member of the Warren Commission, said that "for the sake of completeness," the official investigation of the Kennedy assassination should have included a look at the late President's autopsy photographs and X-rays.

The Commission had the power to subpoena the films, he said, but chose not to. "We were perhaps a little oversensitive to what we understood was the sensitivities of the Kennedy family against the production of colored photographs of the body, and so forth," he said.

McCloy made the disclosure in a televised interview on Face the Nation (CBS-WTOP).
