

### **CBS urges 'outside' assassination probe**

Citing the need for "an outside investigation" of the Martin Luther King assassination, CBS News concludes that "the case against James Earl Ray was not airtight," in the third of a four-part series on political assassinations airing on CBS Friday.

In the final segment of the series, airing on Monday, correspondent Dan Rather and the CBS News team report that the evidence does not point to a second gun in the Robert F. Kennedy case. And despite Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace's suspicion of a conspiracy in his attempted assassination, CBS researchers found no evidence for such a belief.

In summing up the conclusions of the six-month-long investigation, Mr. Rather cites "the general decline in confidence that our institutions and the people who run them are honest," as he calls for further official investigations in the John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King cases.
