so hecessary to full understanding of it all.

You may be amused to hear that after the interview there were a number of <u>collect</u> calls to me from all over the country. I did not accept the charges on any, and they all evaporated.

I told Crile I thought the passage of time and emergence of "revelations" had made you look very good indeed, you may remember giving me off-the-record speculation about Cuban involvement long, long ago when we first talked about the WCReport. He seemed surprised and perhaps too young to accept the idea that anybody else (besides him) knew anything, and earlier than he. Made me feel quite old.
