## PURPOSE:

The purpose of this memorandum is to respond to a request made by Richard Salant, President, CBS News, to Attorney General Levi, to conduct interviews in connection with the assassination of John F. Kennedy.

## DETAILS:

In a letter dated October 8, 1975, Mr. Salant advised Mr. Levi that a request made by Leslie Midgley, CBS Producer, and Dan Rather, the principal CDS correspondent, to Director Kelley for permission to interview Agents or former Agents who were concerned with the case of Lee Marvey Ocwald, had been denied. This initial request for interviews with James Hosty, Gordon Shanklin, John Pain, and Warren deBrueys was declined because of the ongoing investigation in Dallas by the Department of Justice in connection with A matter.

In his letter to the Attorney General, Mr. Salant modified the original request indicating that since Fain and deBrueys were concerned only with the events in Hew Orleans and not Dallas, he asked if an interview with them would be possible. He stated that if CBS would be unable to talk to these individuals there would be no recourse except to include in the broadcasts the unverified stories of people conmenting concerning the PBI. Mr. Rather " ... would then go on to say that CBS is unable to verify the stories because the PBI

## BACKGROUND:

On October 6, 1975, the Director met with Rather, Midgley, and Sanford Socolow of CBS news in connection with this matter. Subsequent to that meeting it was determined, from a conversation you (Mr. Moore) had with Mr. Midgley, that CBS has a source identified as a former PBI informant, who was known to deBrueys. This source has indicated to CBS that Oswald was an PBI informant and that after the assassination of President Kennedy, deBrueys told him (the source) that if he said anything to the Warren Commission that he (deBrueys) would "kick his a--." With regard to Pain, Midgley indicated that he had information that in August, 1963, Pain debriefed Oswald upon his return to the United States from Russia.

The name of Oreste Pena appeared in the Warren Commission Report as having been in contact with deBrueys concerning Cuban activities in the New Orleans area, and he is very likely the former PBI source who is talking to CBS. It is important to note that in the Warren Commission Report Pena indicated a strong dislike for deBrueys and the PBI.

The Intelligence Division, in their review of this matter, could not give unequivocal assurance that Pena is the FBI informant mentioned by CBS.

Fain retired from the PBI on October 9, 1962; therefore, it would not appear that he could have debriefed Oswald during August, 1963.

## ODSERVATIONS:

It would appear that both deBrueys and Fain, in an interview with CBS, would be able to adequately respond to these questions, and in so doing put the PDI's actions in a better perspective. deBrueys has been contacted regarding this matter and feels strongly that with an opportunity to review and refresh his recollection in this matter he could properly discount Pena's contention that Oswald was an PBI informant. It would appear to be our advantage to have deBrueys and Fain respond in order that our position in this investigation be set forth as accurately as possible. Assistant

Director Wannall agrees to authorizing the interviews of Fain and deBrueys provided the guestions are restricted to the New Orleans activities of Oswald.

A copy of the proposed letter from Attorney General Levi to Mr. Salant, that was given to Mr. Levi, is attached for your information.

## RECOUPENDATION:

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That CES News be authorized to interview Warren deBrueys and John Fain with the stipulation that questions be confined only to the New Orleans phase of the Oswald investigation.

# PROPOSED LETTER FROM AG LEVI TO RICHARD SALANT, PRESIDENT, CES NEWS, RE REQUEST TO INTERVIEW JOHN FAIN AND WARREN DE BRUEYS

Dear Dick:

I have read your letter of October 8, in which you advised of the proposed interviews of PBI personnel concerning Lee Harvey Oswald.

I have contacted Director Kelley about your request to interview Warren deBrueys, who is now Special Agent in Charge of the San Juan, Puerto Rico, Office, and John Fain, who is retired from the FBI. We are in accord and interpose no objection to these interviews being conducted provided all questions asked be confined to the New Orleans activities of Lee Harvey Oswald. Our current inquiry in Dallas at this time precludes interviews of Gordon Shanklin and James Hosty.
