

Levi Clarifies Stand On CIA Prosecution

Attorney General Edward Levi said today that he would expect to be informed by President Ford whether any prosecution of government officials for past CIA activities involved in assassination plots or domestic wrongdoing.

The Attorney General has made clear to the President that he does not see any room for the two statements to coexist. Justice Department spokesman Robert Feldkamp said yesterday they did discuss this and Ford had no problem with it.

Levi read The Post account and then "said there is plenty of room for the two statements to coexist," Feldkamp related. "The President certainly would be notified routinely if any prosecution of the department would result."

Levi said last week he would not expect the President to tell the department what to do.
