

# Paper Says It Will List CIA Names

PARIS, Jan. 2—A left-wing French newspaper said today that it plans to publish the names of 60 alleged Central Intelligence Agency members working in France. President Ford has said that similar identification of Richard Welch as an agent in a Greek newspaper led to his assassination in Athens last month.

The U.S. embassy here declined formal comment on the plans of the French newspaper Liberation to publish the list. Liberation staff members said today that the names will be published in a week to 10 days.

Embassy sources said they knew of no provision under French law by which they could seek to halt publication of the list. Mr. Ford said this week that public identification had resulted in the death "of one fine official and . . . could result in the death of others."
