Cuban Aide Sees Mexico President

MEXICO CITY, Sept. 12 (UPI)—Cuban Foreign Minister Raul Roa met today for nearly two hours with President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz in a meeting brought about by steadily worsening relations between the two countries.

A spokesman for the Mexican president described the meeting at the presidential residence as "very cordial," but did not disclose the topics discussed.

Diplomatic sources said Roa's sudden visit might be an effort by Cuba to patch up misunderstandings over Cuban charges of espionage against the press attache at the Mexican Embassy in Havana, Humberto Carrillo Colon.

Colon returned to Mexico after Cuba accused him of spying on behalf of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency, and Diaz Ordaz ordered Cuba's note protesting Colon's activities to be returned to Havana as "inadmissible."

Mexico is the only Latin American nation that maintains diplomatic and commercial relations with Casto's regime, which was expelled from the Organization of American States in 1961.
