"Corporations were more than generous in loaning their executives and resources for OSS service.

"The J. Walter Thompson Advertising Agency supplied the chief of the OSS Planning Staff, the head of the Morale Operations Branch in London, the executive officer of OSS in Cairo, and a 'black propaganda' specialist in Casablanca.

"The Standard Oil Company provided officers in Spain and Switzerland to watch Axis oil shipments and helped plan the sabotage of Axis-operated petroleum fields in Romania.

"Paramount Pictures provided foreign currency for espionage operations in Finland and Sweden.

"The Goldman, Sachs banking firm handled the payment of two million Algerian francs to resistance groups in North Africa.

"In fact, the corporate spirit permeated the executive offices of (OSS Director of Strategic Service, General William 'Wild Bill') Donovan's headquarters.

"To the general's amusement, a blue-ribbon committee of OSS executives, uneasily chaired by liberal public opinion pollster Elmo Roper, recommended that Donovan's nest of spies and saboteurs should be restructured like a 'holding
