The FBI-assisted fiction has been terrible misinformation. These were deceived and misled by it include Congressional committees. It was an important part of the overall assassination story and of what the executive agencies did and did not do. All pertinent information should be disclosed.

It is incredible that under any circumstances the FBI would believe there remained any secrecy with the most widely syndicated column, Drew Pearson, was involved. In fact he published the story, as the FBI's own files reflect.

The Castro kickback part of this fun and games with the investigation and the historical record includes unfair post-Commission criticisms of the FBI for allegedly not letting the Commission know of a Castro interview taken to contain a threat against JFK. While it is not unfair to say that the FBI was not over-anxious in informing the Commission, it did inform it and under date of 6/14/64 the Secret Service provided facsimiles of several accounts, including the very one the Church subcommittee said was withheld from the Commission. The Commission was aware of the stories and asked the Secret Service to obtain copies, which it did.
