Prof 5-6-76 Nathaniel Davis' Recall Demanded

Reuter BERNE, Switzerland, May 5—A Geneva-based group that calls itself the "Committee for the Support of the Chilean People" has issued an 80-page pamphlet to launch a campaign for the recall of newly named U.S. Ambassador to Switzerland Nathaniel Davis.

The group claims that Davis, 51, who was ambassador to Chile in 1973 when a military coup overthrew Marxist President Salvador Allende, was a "destabliszation" agent who had close ties to the CIA during his time in Chile.

Chile. It says that Davis' presence in Switzerland "constitutes a real danger for the future of certain European nations." The embassy has denied the charges

Last September the swiss government rejected similar accusations against Davis.
