

Allende Didn't Crush

Media, Widow Says

COPENHAGEN, Sept. 29 (AP) — The widow of deposed Chilean President Salvador Allende said today that her husband's government never intended to destroy the opposition media, as charged by President Ford and Secretary of State Henry Kissinger.

"There was never any thought of setting up a government monopoly of the media," Hortensia Bussi de Allende said in an interview.

In a recent news conference, President Ford justified Central Intelligence Agency activity against Allende by saying the Marxist president had attempted to crush opposition.
