

Is it true that former CIA Director William Colby was paid \$1000 not to lecture on a New York campus recently?

In a manner of speaking, yes. After the speakers committee at Ithaca College (in Ithaca, N. Y.) signed a \$2000 contract with Colby's lecture agency, students who disliked Colby's politics convinced the student congress to rescind the invitation. That, of course, did not rescind the contract, but Colby settled for half the amount.
