1.000 Posts to Be Abolished

By SEYMOUR M. HERSH Special to The New York Times WASHINGTON, March 20-James R. Schlesinger, the new Director of Central Intelligence, has begun the largest personnel cutback in the history of the agency.

Unofficial C.I.A. sources esti-

mated that at least 1,000 and possibly as many as 1,800 of the agency's approximately 18,000 jobs would be abolished by the end of the current fiscal year, June 30.

An official agency source acknowledged that what he termed a "reduction in force" known in the Government as a RIF- was under way "on a very selective basis" to eliminate "marginal performers." But he would give no figures for the cutback.

No official announcement of the cutbacks has been made to employes at the C.I.A. head-
