

(GREENSBURG)--A WESTMORELAND COUNTY MAN SAYS HE WON'T GIVE UP HIS LEGAL BATTLE AGAINST THE SECRET FUNDING OF THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY WON'T STOP UNTIL THE GOVERNMENT MAKES PUBLIC THE AGENCY'S ANNUAL BUDGET. WILLIAM RICHARDSON, A FORMER C-I-A AGENT FROM GREENSBURG, SAYS HE'LL FIGHT TO HIS LAST BREATH. RICHARDSON COMMENTED YESTERDAY AFTER THE U.S. SUPREME COURT GRANTED THE GOVERNMENT A HEARING IN ITS ATTEMPT TO BLOCK A DISCLOSURE SUIT FILED BY RICHARDSON.

RICHARDSON ALLEGES THAT THERE IS NO PROVISION MADE FOR C-I-A ACCOUNTING IN THE GOVERNMENT'S ANNUAL STATEMENT OF RECORDS. HE SAYS THE FUNDS ARE PROTECTED BY THE NATIONAL SECURITY ACT OF 1949 AND ARE HIDDEN IN THE NUMEROUS ACCOUNTS OF AGENCIES WITHIN THE GENERAL ACCOUNTING.
