The final segment of the afternoon's agenda was a demonstration of explosive and incendiary devices at the [redacted] Range by representatives of [redacted] Division.

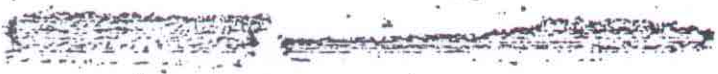
