RESOLUTION

1 Resolved, That (a) there is hereby established in the 2 House of Representatives a Select Committee on Intelligence 3 to conduct an inquiry into the organization, operations, and 4 oversight of the intelligence community of the United States 5 Government.

6 (b) The select committee shall be composed of ten
7 Members of the House of Representatives to be appointed
8 by the Speaker. The Speaker shall designate one of the
9 Members as chairman.

10 (c) For the purposes of this resolution the select com11 mittee is authorized to sit during sessions of the House and
12 during the present Congress whether or not the House has

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recessed or adjourned. A majority of the members of the
 select committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction
 of business except that the select committee may designate a
 lesser number as a quorum for the purpose of taking
 testimony.

6 SEC. 2. The select committee is authorized and directed 7 to conduct an inquiry into—

8 (1) the collection, analysis, use, and cost of intelli-9 gence information and allegations of illegal or improper 10 activities of intelligence agencies in the United States 11 and abroad;

(2) the procedures and effectiveness of coordination among and between the various intelligence components of the United States Government;

(3) the nature and extent of executive branch oversight and control of United States intelligence activities;
(4) the need for improved or reorganized oversight by the Congress of United States intelligence activities;
(5) the necessity, nature, and extent of overt and covert intelligence activities by United States intelligence instrumentalities in the United States and abroad;

(6) the procedures for and means of the protection of sensitive intelligence information;

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(7) procedures for and means of the protection of

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1	rights and privileges of citizens of the United States from
2	illegal or improper intelligence activities; and
3	(8) such other related matters as the select com-
4	mittee shall deem necessary to carry out the purposes of
5	this resolution.
6	SEC. 3. In carrying out the purposes of this resolution,
7	the select committee is authorized to inquire into the activities
8	of the following:
9	(1) the National Security Council;
10	(2) the United States Intelligence Board;
11	(3) the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory
12	Board;
13	(4) the Central Intelligence Agency;
14	(5) the Defense Intelligence Agency;
15	(6) the intelligence components of the Departments
16	of the Army, Navy, and Air Force;
17	(7) the National Security Agency;
18	(8) the Intelligence and Research Bureau of the
19	Department of State;
20	(9) the Federal Bureau of Investigation;
21	(10) the Department of the Treasury and the De-
22	partment of Justice;
23	(11) the Energy Research and Development Ad-
24	ministration; and

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(12) any other instrumentalities of the United 1, States Government engaged in or otherwise responsible $\mathbf{2}$ for intelligence operations in the United States and abroad.

SEC. 4. The select committee may require, by subpena $\mathbf{5}$ or otherwise, the attendance and testimony of such witnesses 6 and the production of such books, records, correspondence, 7 8 memorandums, papers, and documents as it deems necessary. Subpenas may be issued over the signature of the chairman 9 of the select committee or any member designated by him, 10 and may be served by any person designated by the chair-11 man or such member. The chairman of the select committee, 12or any member designated by him, may administer oaths 13 14 to any witness.

15 SEC. 5. To enable the select committee to carry out the purposes of this resolution, it is authorized to employ investi-16 gators, attorneys, consultants, or organizations thereof, and 1718 clerical, stenographic, and other assistance.

SEC. 6. (a) The select committee shall institute and 19 carry out such rules and procedures as it may deem necessary 20to prevent (1) the disclosure, outside the select committee, 21of any information relating to the activities of the Central 22Intelligence Agency or any other department or agency of 23the Federal Government engaged in intelligence activities, 24obtained by the select committee during the course of its 25

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study and investigation, not authorized by the select com mittee to be disclosed; and (2) the disclosure, outside the
 select committee, of any information which would adversely
 affect the intelligence activities of the Central Intelligence
 Agency in foreign countries or the intelligence activities in
 foreign countries of any other department or agency of the
 Federal Government.

(b) No employee of the select committee or any person 8 engaged by contract or otherwise to perform services for the 9 select committee shall be given access to any classified infor-10 mation by the select committee unless such employee or per-11 son has received an appropriate security clearance as deter-12mined by the select committee. The type of security clear-13 ance to be required in the case of any such employee or per-14son shall, within the determination of the select committee, 15be commensurate with the sensitivity of the classified infor-16 mation to which such employee or person will be given 1718 access by the select committee.

19 (c) As a condition for employment as described in 20 section 5 of this resolution, each person shall agree not to 21 accept any honorarium, royalty, or other payment for a 22 speaking engagement, magazine article, book, or other en-23 deavor connected with the investigation and study undertaken 24 by this committee.

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1 SEC. 7. The expenses of the select committee under this 2 resolution shall not exceed \$750,000 of which amount not to 3 exceed \$100,000 shall be available for the procurement of 4 the services of individual cosultants or organizations thereof. 5 Such expenses shall be paid from the contingent fund of the 6 House upon vouchers signed by the chairman of the select 7 committee and approved by the Speaker.

8 SEC. 8. The select committee is authorized and directed 9 to report to the House with respect to the matters covered 10 by this resolution as soon as practicable but no later than 11 January 3, 1976.

SEC. 9. The authority granted herein shall expire three
months after the filing of the report with the House of
Representatives.
