By previous arrangement, I suppose that call sponsored by maker's story on IV, a young staffer mased Conway from HeCovern's office spent yesterday morning and early afternoon here. Expecting calls, I gave him a IV opened to the transcript to read when I had to answer them. He found it fascinating.

It is his, so I presume perhaps also the official wiedon of his office, that today emough Senators are concerned over Chile to make some stand of inquiry possible. All things considered, although he may be low in the chain, I decided to be quite candid with him and was, including on the probabilities once the effort was launched.

I also suggested some background reading and in confidence updated him on what E have in The Unimpendment that is relevant. It was all new to him. I wern all, not just the contents of the incomplete book. Jist general ideas after enough time in the military to make captain. Nice fellow, though.

I misced a recent forum on the CIA. He had not. Braden still gung ho! in CIA's defense, he says. So I thought it appropriate to give him what I could recall of a long list of those close enough to ReDovern with CIA pasts. He was surprised. And took notes.

He works for Holms, legislative assisstant.

What I sought to emphasize is the need for brase balls if his can does more than introduce still another motion. What he can expect to face, etc. In response he told me that by the end of the campaign the staff had the impression that they had been thoroughly penetrated by all the spook agencies. They felt they had identified a number of workers with specific agencies by the time it was over. They emempedate this as unprofessionalists on their part, still another kind of naivete, I think. Would have he poend with 1000 from the party accining with any kind of past-center prigram espousel.

To oue him in on what he faces I told him that McG had circred such a resulution in 1965 and that by the time I got to the office I could see nobody on it.

However, he has been assigned to this, so I suppose from that and the interest he displayed here he'll read at least the transcript in IV (I tried to get him to see what understanding he could get from the FOI experience) and report to the La, who may or may
