Sen. Jacob K. Javits (R., N.Y.) Thursday released tape transcripts of remarks made by his opponent, Democrat Ramsey Clark, and broadcast by Radio Hanoi when the former U.S. attorney general visited North Vietnam in 1972.

Javits obtained the transcripts from the CIA. Since the transcripts were unclassified, the Freedom of Information Act requires their release upon request. Javits requested the tapes on Oct. 11.

Clark, a candidate for Javits' seat in the Nov. 5 election, said that the tapes contained nothing he hadn't already said in the United States. "If he (Javits) wanted to know about my 1972 trip, all he had to do is look at the scores of publica-tions which reported it throughout the United States," Clark said.
