CIA Outpost Reported In Miami Until 1968

MIAMI (UPI) — From 1962 until 1968, the Central Intelligence Agency operated an outpost south of here that was the agency's largest installation outside its headquarters at Langley, Va., the Miami Herald reported yesterday.

The installation, known by insiders as JM WAVE and by outsiders as Zenith Technological Services, was located at the University of Miami's remote south campus and was engaged in watching Cuba, the Herald said.

The report said the CIA occupie¹ 1,517 acres of heavily wooded land ar i was among the Miami area's largest employers.

QUOTING AN unnamed former CIA officer as its primary source, the Herald said the oupost was headquarters for 400 officers of the agency's clandestine services branch.

It maintained in Miami a 200-man Cuban secret police force and Cuban agents numbering in the thousands, the Herald said.

The secret police force in exile, the Herald said, was "ready to be shipped to Cuba to establish an instant pro-U.S. ministry of the interior should the occasion present itself."
