

Symposium on CIA Set Next Week

A three-day symposium on CIA involvement in U.S. politics, featuring speakers who have questioned the official reports on the assassination of President John Kennedy, will open in Madison next week.

Among the speakers will be Mark Lane, author of a book and producer of a film on the Kennedy assassination, who has been investigating the Dallas killing for more than 10 years.

The talks will be delivered Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 8 p.m. in the Great Hall of the University of Wisconsin Memorial Union.

Sponsoring the three-day affair are the Wisconsin Student Association and Take Over, a Madison underground newspaper.

Lane and Katz, a member of the Boston-based Assassination Information Bureau, are also scheduled for a 1 p.m. press conference in the City Council chambers when a copy of the Zaprunder film of the Kennedy assassination will be shown.

Lane and Katz will be the speakers at the 8 p.m. presentation Tuesday when the Zaprunder film will again be shown, along with a slide show.

On Wednesday, the evening speakers will be John Marks, co-author of "CIA and The Fall of Intelligence," and Doug Porter, member of the "Fifth Estate," a Washington, D. C. organization investigating the CIA.

Title of their talk will be the "CIA and Domestic Intelligence."

Marks and journalist Carl Oglesby will hold a 2:15 p.m. press conference Wednesday in the City-County Building.

Oglesby will speak on "Yankees and Cowboys" for the Wednesday evening presentation. The talk will analyze cold war politics, with a discussion to follow.

Oglesby is the author of "Contentment and Change" and has written for the Boston Phoenix.
