British Laborites Demand Ouster of 10 as CIA Agents LONDON A group of La-

bor Party members of Parliament claimed that 10 attaches at the U.S. embassy are members of the Central Intelligence Agency and demanded their immediate expulsion unless the allegation is proved false.

A motion in the House of Commons signed by 34 La-borites cited "the long rec-ord of intelligence-gathering activities and clandestine operations" organized by the CIA, including "subversion and overthrow of governments in Guata-mala, Iran, Guyana, Chile

and other countries."
It called on Prime Minister Harold Wilson's government to inform the United States that evidence exists to indicate that 10 persons accorded diplomatic credentials are associated with the CIA. One of the Laborites identified the leader of the CIA team at the U.S. embassy as Cord Meyer. An embassy spokesman declined comment.
