CIA Commission To Seek Extension

Vice President Rockefeller time. All were officials from said yesterday that the presidue CIA's operations directordential commission investigat ate. ing the CIA's domestic activi-ties will ask for a few extra weeks to finish its job.

The investigation was scheduled to conclude April 4, but Rockefeller said the eightmember commission will ask President Ford for an extension "a matter of a few weeks past our deadline."

"It would look as though we're falling a little bit behind," he said.

The commission heard three more secret witnesses yesterday, its ninth full day of private testimony, and had three others on hand but ran out of

Rockefeller refused to discuss in any way allegations that the CIA was engaged in various assassination plots against foreign political lead-

The Vice President said the White House commission would continue to pursue its task - investigating any domestic violations by the CIA of its statutory charter - but Rockefeller was careful not to make any comment that would include the so-called assassination episodes within that field or rule them out.

At the White House yesterday, press secretary Ron Nessen suggested that the allegations of assassination might be better handled by the newly formed Senate intelligence operations committee chaired by Frank Church (D-Idaho) (D-Idaho) which has a broader charter.

"There will be an opportunity for the Church committee to look into this matter," Nes sen said. "The President told Church he would cooperate to the maximum extent."

The subject of, assassina tions conceivably could be construed as "domestic activities" if investigators establish that a plot to murder someone originated within the United States.

Nessen referred reporters to a comment made Sunday on television by White House adviser Donald Rumsfeld who said about assassinations: "It is certainly my impression that this President feels that that is not happening during his presidency and his inten-tion is that it not happen during his administration."
