They also put out a magazine called Africa "eport, est. 1956. Circulation, 11,438. Editor Dr. Aaron Segal. (according to ayers directory.) We have no clips on Segal. Same address as institute.

The magazine also has an office at same address as the institute in New York City.

The Encyclopedia of Associations says that William P. Colter is president of the thing. It was founded in 1953 "to further African development and strengthen understanding between the U.S. and Africa."

They run a lot of student scholarship and trip type groups and have offices in Ivory Coast, Nigeria, Tanzania and Zambia.

The George Weller clip--marked with an X--states flat out that the thing is a state epartment front, dealing in revolution; Hows that for clips?

Its interesting that we didn't mention it in a story the next year when we mentioned the group again.
